The Power of Play: Engaging Your Child Through Every Stage of Early Development

Play is much more than just fun for children; it's a vital part of their growth and learning. From birth to age three, children use play to explore the world around them, developing crucial cognitive, physical, social, and emotional skills.

Learning through Play

For young children, play is the primary way they learn. It allows them to use all their senses to understand their environment. Whether they're stacking blocks, imitating adult behaviors, or exploring new textures, each activity contributes to their understanding of the world. Play is often called the "work of childhood," and for good reason—it's how children experiment, discover, and learn.





Parents play a crucial role in their child's playtime. As a child's first and most important playmate, parents are uniquely positioned to foster learning and development. By actively engaging in play, parents help build their child's confidence, communication skills, and sense of self-worth. Simple interactions, like playing peek-a-boo or rolling a ball back and forth, can have significant developmental benefits.

Ensuring Safe and Supportive Play

As children grow, they become more mobile and curious, which means that a safe play environment is essential. Parents should provide just enough guidance to help their child explore and learn independently, allowing the child to experience both success and problem-solving opportunities.

Age-Specific Play Activities

- Birth to 12 Months: Play at this stage involves sensory exploration. Babies learn through activities like shaking a rattle, feeling different textures, and engaging in games like peek-a-boo.
- 12 to 24 Months: As toddlers start to walk and develop fine motor skills, their play becomes more complex. Activities like stacking blocks, simple puzzles, and pretend play help them explore new skills.
- 24 to 36 Months: Older toddlers engage in more imaginative play, often imitating adult behaviors and interacting with peers. This stage is crucial for developing social skills, language, and creativity.

Tips for Engaging in Play

To make the most of playtime, parents should focus on simple, open-ended toys that encourage creativity and physical activity. Avoid relying on electronic toys that claim to boost intelligence; instead, choose items that allow your child to explore, create, and interact with the world around them.



Play is an essential part of early childhood development, providing the foundation for learning and growth. By engaging in play with your child, you help them build the skills they need to navigate the world, fostering their development and strengthening your bond.

Asking Questions to Stretch Your Child's Thinking

When you ask your children questions—especially big, open-ended ones—you support their language development and critical thinking. Instead of asking questions with a one-word answer ("Who is your friend?") or only one right answer ("What color is the crayon?"), try to open the door to conversations in a new way. During family routines like mealtimes or bathtime, while reading bedtime stories together or taking walks, or when you ask your child about their day at preschool, use the following strategies to encourage them to talk about themselves, their ideas, and their reflections.

1. Ask open-ended questions to spark conversations.

Pose questions that will encourage your child to analyze, evaluate, and create, such as

- What was the best (hardest, funniest, saddest) thing about your day at preschool?
- What book did your teacher read today? Tell me the story.
- If you had written the story, how would you have changed it?
- If you were cooking for our family, what would you make for breakfast (lunch, dinner)? Why?
- 2. Allow plenty of wait time. Children need time to process what you're saying, think about it, and then answer. Give them at least a few seconds to respond, and vary the time according to their needs. You know your child best! If the question is one they don't yet have the vocabulary to answer, modify it. During bathtime, for example, if your child doesn't answer when you ask where they think it would be most fun to take a bath, ask if they would rather take a bath at home or at Grandma's house and why. As your child grows and develops, their vocabulary will expand.
- 3. Listen to your child's responses. Use active listening strategies: make eye contact, encourage your child to share their ideas, and restate or summarize what they say. For example, "You've told me that you love all of the books your teacher reads about animals. Let's go to the library and see if we can find some other books about animals to read at home. Which animals would you like to start with?"

4. Ask another question or make a comment after your child answers. This further extends your conversation. If you aren't sure how to respond, you can almost always say, "What else can we add to that?" or "Tell me more about that." For example, "You told me yesterday that your favorite song in preschool is 'Wheels on the Bus.' Let's make up a song to that tune to sing at breakfast that starts with, "One food on the table is toast, toast, toast, toast, ..."

<u>5. Have fun together!</u> Don't be afraid to use some big, juicy words to expand your child's vocabulary. You'll be amazed how they add these words to their conversations, once introduced. For example, "You have told me so much about the rock collection in preschool. Maybe you will be a geologist when you grow up." Or "Let's listen to that song you told me about when an orchestra performs it, rather than just a small band."

Sample Open-Ended Questions

- What book did your teacher read today? Tell me the story.
- What foods did you see at preschool today that were new or different? Tell me about them.
- What are some words we could use to describe the chicken (rice, vegetables) we're eating? Let's think of words that describe how it smells (tastes, sounds like when we chew).
- What do you think the story will be about? (Look at the front and back covers.)
- What did you think about the story? Did you like it? Why?
- What was your favorite part? Why?
- Can you think of a different ending? Tell me about it.

Benefits for Child Care Centers, Family and Group Home Providers

Availability

Alabama's new Special Needs Childcare Subsidy is available statewide.

Reimbursement

Participating centers will be reimbursed \$250 per week. There is no penalty when a child is not in attendance, so the center will be reimbursed regardless of attendance.

Inclusion Support

Childcare staff will have FREE access to training, consultation, technical assistance, and adaptive materials provided by Childcare Enhancement with a Purpose (CCEP) Inclusion Consultants statewide to support inclusion in the classroom.



About the Subsidy

Financial assistance is now available for qualifying Alabama families of a child with special needs to attend quality, inclusive childcare programs statewide. To qualify, the child must be receiving services (IFSP, IEP, private therapy, etc.).
